We began as two shelters, each with long histories of serving homeless animals in Midcoast Maine. Now as one of the largest shelters in Maine, we're saving nearly 3,000 animals every year and providing resources to our community members to make them the best pet parents they can be.

WHAT WE DO

Adoptions Midcoast Humane takes in over 3,000 homeless animals every year and finds them loving homes like yours! Life-Saving Care All adoptable dogs, cats, and rabbits are spayed/neutered and up-to-date on vaccinations. Many require additional medical procedures and other life-saving treatment.

Stray Animal Care All stray and abandoned animals from our contracted towns have a home with us— whether they are brought in by Animal Control Officers or kind individuals who find them.

Transport and Rescue Space permitting, we take in animals from overcrowded shelters across the country, other Maine shelters, and shelters in areas affected by natural disasters. Typically we rescue 1,000 animals via transport per year. Relocation saves lives!

Resources for Pet Owners We offer low-cost wellness clinics to provide pet owners with access to affordable vaccinations and routine medical care. We also offer spay/neuter help, and assistance for pet owners whose pets require emergency medical care. We distribute pet food through our Pet Food Pantry and area food banks, and believe all pets in our community should be well-fed.

Re-homing Relinquished Pets We accept and re-home surrendered pets from residents of our contracted towns if they can no longer care for the animal. Each animal is given medical care, love and attention.

Reunite Lost Pets Each year we reunite an average of 300 pets with their families.

Behavior and Training Our KPA certified trainer works with adopters and community members to help keep pets in loving homes. We use fear-free, reward-based positive reinforcement training methods that are backed by science and rooted in the highest professional standards to ensure that animals in our community are mentally healthy, and as a result, happy.
